

#### The Third Edition of the Specialist Training Manual will be shipping in June!

It is a great pleasure to have participated in the creation of the 3rd Edition of the ECMO Specialists Training Manual. This edition is the product of many individuals representing 18 ECMO centers across the country. As Co-Editor of the first edition, it was amazing to see the changes that had occurred between that edition and the second. It's now been 10 years between the 2nd Edition and this 3rd Edition, with enormous changes in the patient populations treated, the equipment used, and clinical management protocols for ECLS support. To that end we have added 8 new chapters outlining physiology of the major categories of patients being treated (neonatal respiratory, pediatric respiratory, adult respiratory and cardiac patients of all ages). We have also added chapters on ECPR, hemofiltration, plasmapheresis, and two exciting chapters on case scenarios and trouble shooting for the ECMO Specialists.

Training of the bedside ECMO specialist remains a priority. This manual was developed to assist ECMO centers in the training and education of the ECMO team in their institution. To further assist in the education of ECMO practitioners, test questions and answers are at the end of each chapter. This manual should be used in conjunction with the existing educational material specific to the individual ECMO center. The material presented in this manual has been written by authors from various ECMO centers, but an attempt has been made to represent general ECMO practice. Techniques specific to a single institution may not be fully covered in this manual, thus requiring each institution to enhance those topics with additional information.

We all do wonderful work and this is our chance to tell everyone just how wonderful we are. Answer each question fully and include at least one example of how your program achieves that requirement. Venovenous ECMO for Adult Respiratory Failure An ELSO Course Jointly Sponsored by Legacy Health July 16-17, 2010 Portland Oregon

This intense 2 day course is designed for all physicians caring for adult patients with severe acute respiratory failure including H1N1, other viral or bacterial pneumonias, burn and inhalation injury, traumatic lung injury and pulmonary contusion, pulmonary embolism, post-shock or sepsis associated ARDS, or other forms of reversible acute lung injury or illness, who may be candidates for Extracorporeal Respiratory Support. Course content includes indications and contraindications, cannulation techniques, initiation of support, patient and circuit physiology of VV ECMO, programmatic design and management, all aspects of patient management and decision making for patients on VV ECMO, as well as ECMO circuit component function, design and management. The course is appropriate for centers setting up new programs, or for existing centers expanding into adult services. Registration is \$800/person, and includes the "Red Book". Space is limited to 100. There are 18 spaces available for a Saturday afternoon simulation session (additional \$400 fee applies).

A 3 day **specialist training workshop** on the same topic will run July 16 - July 18. This workshop will have didactic sessions on Friday and Saturday and on Sunday simulation sessions. Registration is \$1,200 per person and includes the 3<sup>rd</sup> edition of the ECMO Specialist Training Manual! Space is limited to 36.

There is very little known regarding the optimal antibiotic prophylaxis regimen including the appropriate spectrum and duration. We will be sending a short survey shortly to inquire about your center's current practice regarding antibiotic prophylaxis for your ECMO patients as part of one of the new ELSO sponsored grants. We thank you in advance for your participation as the results will be helpful in planning future prospective studies.

Dr. Kevin Lally Children's Memorial Hermann Hospital Houston, TX Little is known about whether the composition of the ECMO team influences patient outcome. We are inviting you to participate in a research study by completing a survey that will help us explore this association. Participating in this study is voluntary.

This survey is being conducted in collaboration with Matthew Moront, MD, Dominick M. Carella, RN, MSN from St. Christopher's Hospital for Children and Heidi Dalton, MD, FCCM and Alicia Schmidt, RN, BSN from Phoenix Children's Hospital and will take about 5 minutes to complete. We plan to use these survey results to examine the association between ECMO pump team composition and outcome. After the survey has finished, ELSO will provide the necessary registry data for this analysis. Although we ask you to include your institution name, this is only for tracking purposes and will not be used to identify individual institutions in the analysis. ELSO will link our survey results with institution then create a random identification number in place of institution name. The data analyst will not receive registry data with institution name.

For your privacy we are using Secure Sockets Layer (SSL) on Survey Monkey to encrypt all surveys. SSL is used for transmitting information privately over the Internet. Many corporations and academic institutions require SSL when collecting data. SSL is supported in all modern browsers.

By clicking "start survey" you are giving your consent to participate in this study.

You or your institution will not benefit directly from participating in this survey. However, the study results may be used to provide documentation about whether the type of professional who runs the ECMO pump has an effect on outcome, which may change practice patterns in some states. This may lead to a broader availability of ECMO.
