First, the ELSO Registry captured its 200,000th patient earlier in the year, thanks to so many centers submitting

invaluable data. The importance of this resource can be measured in many ways, not least of which is the number of annual publications using ELSO Registry data. For example, in 2010, there were 5 such publications, in 2015 12, in 2020 26, and in 2022 over 40, reflecting the increasing interest and importance of ECMO to clinicians and researchers.

Second, over 100,000 patients in the Registry have received ECMO and survived to hospital discharge (<u>https://www.elso.org/registry/elsoliveregistrydashboard.aspx</u>). Reflect on that for a minute: Over 100,000 people have survived critical illness through the use of this technology, patients who would have most likely died without it. While these thresholds in and of themselves are not of particular importance, they do provide a sense of scale and help fuel our work. They also provide another opportunity to thank and pay tribute to the pioneers of ECMO, in particular the founder of ELSO, Dr Robert Bartlett. It must be quite something to reflect that your life's work has saved so many, particularly young patients with their lives ahead of them. I hope this inspires the next generation of clinicians to similarly heroic feats of imagination and science.

ELSO Registry Chair Joseph Tonna, immediate Past Registry Chair Ryan Barbaro, and co-authors have written the ELSO 2022 Registry Report, which is currently undergoing peer review and which describes in detail the data in the Registry. It will be a valuable reference in the future and we look forward to seeing it published and freely available to everyone. Importantly, leaders from every ELSO member center who responded to our emails will be acknowledged and thus appear as collaborators for this publication in medical search engines such as PubMed. This was done twice before during the COVID-19 pandemic but should set a new standard for the future, reflecting that Registry data is not collected by a small group of researchers but by thousands of people across the planet.



Third, ELSO published several new resources in 2023. These included, (i) a monograph on adult post-cardiotomy ECLS, (ii) a monograph on neonatal and pediatric ECMO simulation scenarios, (iii) a translation of the 5th edition of the Red Book into Korean, and (iv) an electronic version of the 6th edition of the Red Book. All of these and more can be purchased via the ELSO Publications page (<u>https://www.elso.org/publications.aspx</u>).

Fourth, ELSO opened its own Education and Training Center in Ann Arbor this year. ELSO Foundations, its online training course, has been adopted by many learners and over 1600 clinicians have successfully completed it. A comparable program for neonatal and pediatric practitioners is in development and should go live next year.

Fifth, our annual conference this year was the most popular in ELSO's history, with over 1500 attendees coming to Seattle. Next year, our conference will be in Detroit, only a cab ride away from the home of ELSO, Ann Arbor, MI.

All of this success did not come easily and is the result of a massive amount of work by many people, including the ELSO Board of Directors, Steering Committee, Strategic Advisory Council, ELSO Chapter Chairs and Steering Committees, and all the different subcommittees. The ELSO Office, led by the indefatigable Christine Stead (CEO) and Peter Rycus (Executive Director), does far more with finite resources than we could ever reasonably expect of it. Finally, there are all the directors, members and coordinators of our organization's member centers, without whom ELSO would not exist.

Thank you, everyone, for a great year. Let's hope we have more successes to toast to in 2024.

ELSO has outlined standardized educational criteria and launched an online application process via ELSO Academy for ECMO clinicians who have demonstrated satisfactory completion of criteria listed on our website. This journey is designed to be inclusive of the entire ECMO interprofessional team. Certification is valid for three years; upon which time a renewal can be pursued to maintain certification. Registry Committee

Greetings ELSO Community! We have some exciting announcements from the Registry Committee. First, we are proud to announce, as many of you already know, that we have completed the 2022 ELSO Registry Report (data through year end 2022, prepared/finalized/submitted during 2023). This report is the first since 2016, and importantly, because these reports are **only possible** through the effort of countless individuals at each center, caring for patients, and entering their data, we were able to include center designated representatives (Director, Coordinator) as **collaborating authors**, meaning that your names will appear in PubMed and be searchable. We are so grateful to you all for the work you continue to do and thankful for the efforts of the ELSO leadership team who did the work to get these names together and submitted. We look forward to sharing the finalized published manuscript when it comes out!

Secondly, the Quality Sub-Committee is proud to announce the release of two new reports, using new visualizations, within the Quality Platform (ArborMetrix). These reports are a new step up in the utility of data, informed by a committee of advisors drawn from across ELSO Centers. The reports provide a visualization and measurement of complication rates over time, at your center. Further, the reports enable you to identify a time point when an intervention or change may have happened at your center, and then see the trend in complications prior to and then after that identified point, with associated statistical calculations. We hope this report will be useful as you share your outcomes with your team, administrators, and colleagues, enabling you to visualize the effect of various quality improvement interventions on outcomes that you select.

Case Study

At a recent monthly team meeting a resident described the results of the Rush Medical Center VV adult ECMO protocol. The results are outstanding. One of the components of the protocol is early extubation and spontaneous breathing. *"We tried to do that, but the patient became so agitated he had to be re-intubated and sedated on three different attempts. Are we doing something wrong?"* – remarks submitted to me from Rush.

Yes, you are not following the Rush protocol. Waking the patient up, especially with extubation, requires enough hemoglobin to support the oxygen requirements during the increased metabolic activity of waking up and spontaneous breathing. Rush starts with 12gm/dL and increases as necessary to get the membrane lung output O2 content to the normal level of 20 cc/dL.

What is your circuit outlet O2 content? Do you know? You have to increase the sweep to normalize PCO2. Your patient may be fluid overloaded and very anemic, possibly requiring albumin, diuresis, and transfusion. (Don't worry, it's safe. just do it.)

The Rush physiologic protocol produces 67-85% healthy survival in adult respiratory support patients, including 137 COVID-19, compared to 58% in the Registry and 52% with COVID-19 (see Tatooles, ECMO on Pubmed for the 7 publications). The protocol includes 4 elements which are interdependent: Early extubation and activity, full ECMO support (Hb >12), RA to PA access, and wait for recovery (weeks to months). To use the Rush protocol in your center you must follow all 4 components. The protocol was designed by Lauren Michalak, Erica Bak, and Mike Kotwas and implemented 6 years ago by the Program Director, Tony Tatooles.
