A NOTE ON THE FUTURE OF THE SECTION





CIRCUIT CHATTER EDITION 3

A 72-year-old woman with severe mitral valve prolapse presented in acute cardiogenic shock complicated by pulmonary edema. She was emergently placed on venoarterial ECMO (VA ECMO) support via a 21 Fr drainage cannula in the right femoral vein (advanced to 42 cm) and a 15 Fr return cannula in the left femoral artery (advanced to 13 cm). Despite a pump speed of 3500 RPM, ECMO flow remained persistently low at approximately 2.2 L/min, insufficient to maintain adequate perfusion. High-dose norepinephrine (0.8 mcg/kg/min) was required to maintain a mean arterial pressure (MAP) of 67 mmHg. and severe tissue hypoperfusion was indicated by a markedly elevated serum lactate level of 13 mmol/L. Bedside transthoracic echocardiography (TTE) confirmed that the venous drainage cannula tip was located within the right atrium. Notably, the inferior vena cava (IVC) measured 1.98 cm in diameter on the subxiphoid long-axis view and showed minimal respiratory collapse, indicating adequate intravascular volume and excluding hypovolemia as the cause for low ECMO flow. However, the exact mechanical cause of the poor ECMO flow remained unclear.

Given the persistent low ECMO flow and clinical deterioration, urgent transesophageal echocardiography (TEE) was performed. TEE revealed the drainage cannula had been advanced too far, pressing against the interatrial septum, thereby occluding the main inlet ports and significantly limiting venous inflow. With ECMO temporarily paused, the venous cannula was repositioned, withdrawing it approximately 1.5 cm under TEE guidance. This immediately resolved the obstruction, restoring appropriate ECMO flow and substantially reducing norepinephrine requirements to 0.3 mcg/kg/min to maintain a stable MAP of 65 mmHg.

Following cannula repositioning, the patient's hemodynamic stability quickly improved, ECMO flow rates increased, and serum lactate rapidly declined from 13 mmol/L to 1.6 mmol/L. No further flow issues occurred during subsequent ECMO support.

This case emphasizes a crucial clinical lesson: Persistent low ECMO flow, despite adequate pump speeds, warrants immediate investigation for cannula malposition or mechanical obstruction. TEE is a powerful diagnostic tool that rapidly identifies hidden mechanical issues, guiding timely interventions to significantly improve patient outcomes.
